Legal

Type: Adjective

Example: In Spain it is **legal** for 15-year-olds to drive scooters.



Set 2 – B2 A2

satisfied

Type: Adjective

Example: My parents are **satisfied** with my exam results.



Set 2 – B2 A3

reversible

Type: Adjective

Example: The process of freezing water is **reversible**





Set 2 – B2 A4

replaceable

Type: Adjective

Example: I broke my mother's favourite cup but she told me not to worry because it was **replaceable** - it didn't have any sentimental value.



Set 2 – B2 A5

Legible

Type: Adjective

Example: This example is **legible** because it has been written clearly.



Set 2 – B2 A6

Adequate

Type: Adjective

Example: Most times I produce pieces of writing that are only **adequate**; I know I should try harder.





Set 2 – B2 A7

Similar

Type: Adjective

Example: Your dress sense is **similar** to mine! We have so much in common.



Set 2 – B2 A8

forgettable

Type: Adjective

Example: Last night I saw a film with a **forgettable** plot, it was a bit spontaneous and just didn't make much sense.



Set 2 – B2 A9

affected

Type: Adjective

Example: He was **affected** by his grandfather's death. They were very close.





Set 2 – B2 A10

habitable

Type: Adjective

Example: I took a year off from University and went backpacking around the world. I've stayed in some strange places, but most of them were **habitable**.



Set 2 – B2 V1

Force

Type: Verb

Example: My parents **force** me to go to English lessons, even though I hate languages!



Set 2 – B2 V2

behave

Type: Verb

Example: I normally **behave** well at school, unless I get distracted by my best friend!



Set 2 – B2 V3



approve

Type: Verb

Example: My father does not **approve** of my new partner.
He thinks that they will be a bad influence.



Set 2 – B2 V4



Consider

Type: AVerb

Example: I **consider** myself to be quite organised.



Set 2 – B2 V5



arrange

Type: Verb

Example: I like to **arrange** my weekend at the start of the week.



Set 2 – B2 V6



cover

Type: Verb

Example: When I'm ill and can't go to work, my colleagues normally **cover** for me.

interpret

Type: Verb

Example: Some pieces of writing can be really difficult to **interpret**.



Set 2 – B2 V8



write

Type: Verb

Example: I think I need to **write** another essay as my previous one was inadequate.



Set 2 – B2 V9



appear

Type: Verb

Example: I saw a ghostly figure **appear** in the distance, but it didn't last long.

produce

Type: Verb

Example: An array of companies are starting to **produce** greener products.
